

INVESTMENT STRATEGY

The investment objective of the Fund is to achieve a persistent return with a low level of volatility over the long term and thus to overhaul the rate of inflation and returns on bank deposits in the long run. For this purpose, the Fund invests mainly in high-quality corporate bonds from issuers from the Czech Republic, supplemented by issuers from the EU and possibly other countries, in money market instruments, reverse repo operations and other fixed income instruments. To ensure stability, the fund will use hedging of exchange rate risk against CZK, or interest rate risk using financial derivatives. Current coupons are reinvested and are further appreciated. The Fund does not actively track any index or benchmark.

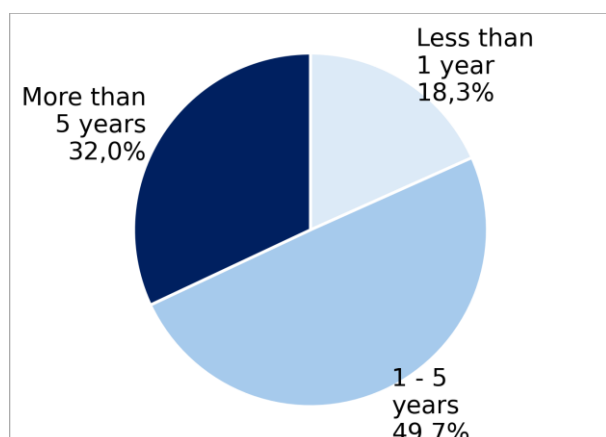

PORTFOLIO MANAGER'S COMMENTARY

The Fund's NAV rose 0.2% in July, managing a positive return even as Eurozone and Czech government bonds priced in the prospect of future higher inflation and interest rates. Both July's resumption of hostilities in the Gulf and the anticipation of higher food and basic materials inflation into the Autumn and Winter months contributed to market uncertainty. European and Czech corporate bond markets remained in a cautious condition after the ECB and CNB had both raised policy rates by 25bps in June. July's Eurozone and Czech consumer price inflation data came in at 2.9% and 1.7% year-on-year. Both Central Banks did opt to keep policy interest rates on hold in their latest meetings on 23 July and 6 August. We remain positioned for the unfolding volatile environment through diversified issuer exposure, large energy-sector holdings and interest-rate swap hedging, which reduce sensitivity to further benchmark yield increases. The Fund's gross yield-to-maturity of 5.9% points to a potential annual return that remains attractive relative to both current and expected inflation and bank deposit rates.
